

# Applying for a Health Card

## Introduction

For temporary residents living in Saskatchewan, you are eligible to apply for a health card for yourself and your dependents to get health benefits. You can complete the application for yourself and your dependents online or by mail. Each adult and their dependents must include copies of documents when applying.

Here are the list of documents:

- Legal entitlement to be in Canada: study permit (confirmation of full-time enrolment is required), work permit, foreign passport with immigration stamp, temporary resident permit etc.
- Saskatchewan residency: signed mortgage, rental, or lease agreement, utility bill (home telephone, cable TV, satellite TV, water, gas, or energy).
- Support of identity: International passport, birth certificate, student ID card, and employee ID.
- Support of identity: International passport, birth certificate, student ID card, and employee ID.

## Applying Online or Mail

To apply online, here is the link to the government website:

You will have to create an account to be able to complete an application for a Saskhealth service card. Registering online is the recommended method because you can track your health card's progress.

Do not forget to upload your supporting documents to your application. Applications are usually processed within four to six weeks after the application is received. The six weeks do not include mailing time.
